Toppenish, WA— Heritage University is hosting two classical musicians in March for a special concert that is part of a state-wide tour.

Pianist Doris Stevenson and violinist Paul Rosenthal are touring together as part of the Piatigorsky Foundation's Washington State tour. The two will play a program of featured masterpieces at the university in Smith Family Hall on Monday, March 22 starting at 5:30 p.m. The concert is free and open to the public.

Doris Stevenson is a critically acclaimed soloist who has played with the Boston Pops and at Carnegie Hall in New York, the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., Salle Pleyel in Paris and Suntory Hall in Tokyo. She is a founding member of the Sitka Summer Music Festival in Alaska.

Paul Rosenthal is a graduate of the Juilliard School and the University of Southern California. He makes his home in Alaska where he is credited for creating and directing the Chamber Music Festival in Sitka. He travels and performs extensively throughout the United States.

The Piatigorsky Foundation is a non-profit organization dedicated to bringing live classical music to remote communities. They are known for performances that are both educational and entertaining.
